

GRANT OPPORTUNITY

The Denver Foundation's Deane Early Learning Equity Grant aims to address systemic barriers within early learning environments for Colorado children birth-8 years old who are Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC).

The Deane Family Fund anticipates awarding three, 3-year grants to qualified non-profits (501(c)(3) organizations).

Each grant will total \$300,000 with an annual award of \$100,000.

Awards can support systems changes at a statewide, regional, or community level.

APPLY ONLINE

Applications should be submitted online. You will need to register on The Denver Foundation's <u>grant application portal</u> before completing your online application. Go to <u>denverfoundation.org</u> and search "online grants" for more information about the portal, <u>FAQs</u>, and links to registration.

DUE DATE

Applications must be submitted online by July 11 by 5:00pm MST.

DEANE EARLY LEARNING EQUITY GRANT

ELIGIBILITY

- Your organization must be a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, or have a 501(c)(3) fiscal sponsor.
- This application is open to organizations across Colorado.
- We encourage applications from BIPOCled organizations and/or those who are meaningfully partnering with BIPOC-led community organizations for project design and implementation.

NOT ELIGIBLE FOR FUNDING:

- Capital projects
- Child care/early learning tuition
- K-12 public, private, or charter schools
- Supplies, materials, or salaries/benefits that are a regular part of doing business (i.e., no supplanting funds)

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

WITHIN THE ONLINE APPLICATION YOU WILL BE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT:

- Your organization's mission
- A detailed summary of your proposed work
- Your organization's current budget and, if applicable, a project budget

PLUS REPONSES TO THE FOLLOWING **QUESTIONS:**

- Each project will individually define: 1) What is the systemic barrier within the early learning environment you are hoping to address? 2) How will your initiative address the systemic barrier you have identified?
- What does success look like at the end of three years? What outcomes do you expect to achieve?
