## HOW BRIC SUPPORTS THE METRO DENVER'S BLACK COMMUNITY

Established on Juneteenth (June 19), the Black Resilience in Colorado (BRIC) Fund explicitly directs resources to address systemic racism and its impact on Black communities across the seven-county Metro Denver region. BRIC is designed to support Black-led and serving nonprofit organizations. Through the Fund, nonprofits will have opportunities to leverage community assets, build organizational capacity, and secure resources during times of crisis.

## BRIC GRANTS

The BRIC Fund offers grants to support the efforts of Black-led and serving nonprofits in Metro Denver. Grants will be made at the discretion of a community-led advisory committee dedicated to improving Black communities in Denver.

Each applicant must meet the following criteria:

- Be a viable 501(c)3 nonprofit organization or have a fiscal sponsor.
- Be Black-led and Black serving. The Denver Foundation defines "Black" as encompassing people of African and Afro-Caribbean descent, including African immigrants and refugees.
- Serve the seven-county Metro Denver area.
- Fit one or more of the identified priorities identified by the community-led advisory committee.
- Priority will be given to organizations with limited or no access to other relief funds, limited or no endowments, and/or limited or no cash reserves.

## BRIC LOAN PROGRAM

The BRIC Fund and Urban Land Conservancy are partnering to launch the BRIC Loans Program, offering low-interest loans for pre-development and capital expenditure to Black-led/serving nonprofit organizations. Starting in January 2021, applications will be accepted for loans up to \$50,000 from the initial pool of \$250,000.
