

# **Long-Term Balanced Pool**



The Long-Term Balanced Pool, the foundation's oldest investment option, presents a long-term diversified investment approach across multiple asset classes, including a substantial weighting to private capital. Allocation to the private markets helps this pool weather market volatility. 


# Sustainable and Responsible Investment (SRI) Pool


(\$241.9 million total market value)



## Assets allocated to diverseowned or -led firms <sup>2</sup>





# **Index Pool**


